RE: Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning and thanks for reading this update. I want to thank everyone for the great work you are doing caring for our patients while still working in the safest way possible. The Infection Prevention team has given us great guidelines to follow that serve to protect everyone in our facility. These practices also protect those in our community and this is one reason the number of cases in our county continues to be low.

The Southeast District Health Department issued a press release late yesterday saying that five more cases have been found in the district. Three of these cases were from Otoe County, one from Johnson County and one from Richardson County. The total number of cases identified in each county in the district is listed below.

As of 9:00 this morning there were 14,735,331 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 14,530,563 cases. There have been 610,776 deaths. Yesterday there had been 606,741 deaths.

In the United States there are now 3,831,591 positive cases, 140,914 deaths and 46,469,524 people that have been tested. Yesterday there were 3,773,832 cases, 140,536 deaths and 45,734,327 people that had been tested. There were 57,759 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday. 10,300 of the new cases were discovered in Florida, 11,000 in California and 8,500 in Texas.

In Nebraska there are now 22,847 cases and there have been 313 deaths. Yesterday there had been 22,583 positive cases and 301 deaths. That makes 264 new confirmed cases identified since yesterday and 105 of the new cases were in Douglas County. 234,896 people have been tested in the state. Yesterday 232,401 people had been tested. We now have had seven confirmed cases in Nemaha County, one in Pawnee County, eleven in Richardson County, nine in Johnson County and thirty-four in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 8,715 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 1,651 confirmed cases in Hall County, 883 cases in Dawson County and 1,873 cases in Dakota County. There are now 70 cases in Gage County and 2,481 cases in Lancaster County. There have been 62 positive cases and one death in the Southeast District Health Department area.
