**RE:** Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning and thanks for reading this update. The Southeast District Health Department issued a press release yesterday afternoon saying that there had been an additional seven cases of COVID-19 discovered in the district. Five of the new cases were in Richardson County, one was from Otoe County and one was from Nemaha County. The total number of cases identified from each county in the district are listed below.

Many states are issuing requirements to wear masks in any public place. Even though Nebraska is not one of those states, I think it is still wise to wear a mask and protect those that you come in contact with.

As of 9:00 this morning there were 15,256,741 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 14,976,453. There have been 624,213 deaths. Yesterday there had been 617,297 deaths.

In the United States there are now 3,972,162 positive cases, 143,193 deaths and 48,020,777 people that have been tested. Yesterday there were 3,902,377 cases, 142,080 deaths and 47,224,382 people that had been tested. There were 69,785 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 1,113 deaths. 9,800 of the new cases were discovered in Florida, 12,000 in California and 12,500 in Texas.

In Nebraska there are now 23,486 cases and there have been 311 deaths. Yesterday there had been 23,190 positive cases and 310 deaths. That makes 296 new confirmed cases identified since yesterday and 122 of the new cases were in Douglas County. 242,621 people have been tested in the state. Yesterday 238,441 people had been tested. We now have had eight confirmed cases in Nemaha County, one in Pawnee County, sixteen in Richardson County, nine in Johnson County and thirty-five in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 9,022 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 1,658 confirmed cases in Hall County, 892 cases in Dawson County and 1,877 cases in Dakota County. There are now 71 cases in Gage County and 2,605 cases in Lancaster County. There have been 69 positive cases and one death in the Southeast District Health Department area.
