RE: Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning and thanks for reading this update. The Southeast District Health Department issued a press release late Friday afternoon saying that they have identified five new cases of COVID-19 in the district. Three of the new cases are in Richardson County, one is in Johnson County and one is in Pawnee County. The total number of cases identified in each county is listed below.

As of 9:00 this morning there were 16,264,048 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 16,076,713. There have been 648,966 deaths. Yesterday there had been 644,661 deaths.

In the United States there are now 4,234,140 positive cases, 146,935 deaths and 51,491,494 people that have been tested. Yesterday there were 4,178,730 cases, 146,463 deaths and 50,635,683 people that had been tested. There were 55,410 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 472 deaths. 9,300 of the new cases were discovered in Florida, 5,800 in California and 3,800 in Texas. Texas had other issues to deal with over the weekend so I imagine that not much testing was performed.

In Nebraska there are now 24,618 cases and there have been 316 deaths. Yesterday there had been 24,395 positive cases and 316 deaths. That makes 213 new confirmed cases identified since yesterday and 93 of the new cases were in Douglas County. 255,464 people have been tested in the state. Yesterday 252,605 people had been tested. We now have had eight confirmed cases in Nemaha County, two in Pawnee County, Nineteen in Richardson County, ten in Johnson County and thirty-five in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 9,558 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 1,681 confirmed cases in Hall County, 914 cases in Dawson County and 1,887 cases in Dakota County. There are now 74 cases in Gage County and 2,785 cases in Lancaster County. There have been 74 positive cases and one death in the Southeast District Health Department area.
