RE: Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning and thanks for reading this update. Just when I was thinking that we live in a state that is managing the spread of COVID-19 pretty well, I hear on the news that anyone from Nebraska traveling to Chicago must quarantine for fourteen days before venturing out into the city. Nebraska is one of several states for which this requirement applies. Maybe we need to do a bit better so that Chicago is not afraid of us.

As of 9:00 this morning there were 16,765,322 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 16,521,620. There have been 660,881 deaths. Yesterday there had been 654,817 deaths.

In the United States there are now 4,361,013 positive cases, 149,351 deaths and 52,985,577 people that have been tested. Yesterday there were 4,295,629 cases, 148,066 deaths and 52,252,334 people that had been tested. There were 65,384 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 1,285 deaths. 9,200 of the new cases were discovered in Florida, 12,600 in California and 8,200 in Texas. 46% of the new cases in the U.S. are in these three states.

In Nebraska there are now 25,157 cases and there have been 321 deaths. Yesterday there had been 24,899 positive cases and 317 deaths. That makes 258 new confirmed cases identified since yesterday and 98 of the new cases were in Douglas County. 261,103 people have been tested in the state. Yesterday 258,827 people had been tested. We now have had thirteen confirmed cases in Nemaha County, five in Pawnee County, seventeen in Richardson County, eleven in Johnson County and thirty-eight in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 9,810 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 1,688 confirmed cases in Hall County, 917 cases in Dawson County and 1,893 cases in Dakota County. There are now 76 cases in Gage County and 2,871 cases in Lancaster County. There have been 84 positive cases and one death in the Southeast District Health Department area.
