RE: Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning and thanks for reading this update. The Southeast District Health Department issued a press release late yesterday afternoon announcing that they have identified an additional seven cases of COVID-19 in their district. Five of the new cases are in Nemaha County, one is in Pawnee County and one is in Richardson County. The total number of cases identified in each county is listed below.

Again I want to remind you that all of us are going through difficult times right now. The path into the future looks uncertain causing us all to be stressed. Please cut the people that you come in contact with a little slack. Remember, in a world where you can be anything, be kind!

As of 9:00 this morning there were 17,061,855 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 16,765,322. There have been 667,808 deaths. Yesterday there had been 660,881 deaths. That's another one million new cases in just four days!

In the United States there are now 4,428,896 positive cases, 150,733 deaths and 53,825,445 people that have been tested. Yesterday there were 4,361,013 cases, 149,351 deaths and 52,985,577 people that had been tested. There were 67,883 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 1,382 deaths. 9,400 of the new cases were discovered in Florida, 14,200 in California and 10,500 in Texas. Texas, California and Florida have now all passed New York in total cases of COVID-19.

In Nebraska there are now 25,442 cases and there have been 324 deaths. Yesterday there had been 25,157 positive cases and 321 deaths. That makes 265 new confirmed cases identified since yesterday and 84 of the new cases were in Douglas County. 264,033 people have been tested in the state. Yesterday 261,103 people had been tested. We now have had eighteen confirmed cases in Nemaha County, six in Pawnee County, eighteen in Richardson County, eleven in Johnson County and thirty-eight in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 9,894 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 1,696 confirmed cases in Hall County, 927 cases in Dawson County and 1,892 cases in Dakota County. There are now 77 cases in Gage County and 2,923 cases in Lancaster County. There have been 91 positive cases and one death in the Southeast District Health Department area.
