RE: Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning and thanks for reading this update. Lots of changes happened yesterday. Omaha passed a mandate to wear a mask inside of public places, which is similar to the mandate in place in Lincoln. Also, the Big 10 canceled fall sports, including football. Shortly after this was announced, the PAC-10 canceled fall sports. I am wondering what will happen with high school sports in the state now that this has happened?

As of 9:00 this morning there were 20,372,619 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 20,119,511. There have been 743,344 deaths. Yesterday there had been 737,126 deaths.

In the United States there are now 5,141,879 positive cases, 165,545 deaths and 63,252,257 people that have been tested. Yesterday there were 5,095,163 cases, 163,473 deaths and 62,513,174 people that had been tested. There were 46,716 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 2,072 deaths.

In Nebraska there are now 29,030 cases and there have been 351 deaths. Yesterday there had been 28,696 positive cases and 348 deaths. 334 new confirmed cases have been identified since yesterday and 178 of the new cases were in Douglas County. 305,732 people have been tested in the state. Yesterday 302,635 people had been tested. We now have had thirty-two confirmed cases in Nemaha County, nine in Pawnee County, twenty-five in Richardson County, thirteen in Johnson County and fifty-two in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 11,532 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 1,750 confirmed cases in Hall County, 967 cases in Dawson County and 1,930 cases in Dakota County. There are now 90 cases in Gage County and 3,344 cases in Lancaster County. There have been 131 positive cases and one death in the Southeast District Health Department area.
