RE: Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning and thanks for reading this update. The Southeast District Health Department updated the information on their website on Monday, August 24nd. There are eight new cases in their area. There were four additional cases in Nemaha County, one additional case in Richardson County, one in Johnson County and two additional cases in Otoe County. This makes a total of 207 cases and two deaths in the district. 128 of the cases were diagnosed in the last thirty days. I encourage you to go to the Southeast District Health Department website (sedhd.org) and review their dashboard. There is a lot of useful information there.

The number of new COVID-19 cases on college campuses across the nation continue to rise. I hope students start to take this disease seriously or we could have a return of hotspots of cases.

As of 9:00 this morning there were 23,679,320 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 23,459,286. There have been 814,008 deaths. Yesterday there had been 809,403 deaths.

In the United States there are now 5,742,308 positive cases, 177,312 deaths and 72,889,910 people that have been tested. Yesterday there were 5,704,505 cases, 176,809 deaths and 72,183,082 people that had been tested. There were 37,803 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 503 deaths.

In Nebraska there are now 32,047 cases and there have been 383 deaths. Yesterday there had been 31,889 positive cases and 378 deaths. 158 new confirmed cases have been identified since yesterday and 96 of the new cases were in Douglas County. 339,600 people have been tested in the state. Yesterday 338,361 people had been tested. We now have had fifty-nine confirmed cases in Nemaha County, ten in Pawnee County, twenty-nine in Richardson County, twenty-one in Johnson County and eighty-eight in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 12,715 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 1,800 confirmed cases in Hall County, 988 cases in Dawson County and 1,963 cases in Dakota County. There are now 118 cases in Gage County and 3,611 cases in Lancaster County.
