RE: Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning and thanks for reading this update. The Southeast District Health Department updated the information on their website on Wednesday, September 9th. There are eight new cases in their area. There were four additional cases in Nemaha County and four additional cases in Richardson County. This makes a total of 317 cases and two deaths in the district. 185 of the cases were diagnosed in the last thirty days. I encourage you to go to the Southeast District Health Department website's dashboard where there is much more information on the cases in this area.

As of 9:00 this morning there were 27,902,002 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 27,615,676. There have been 904,485 deaths. Yesterday there had been 898,426 deaths.

In the United States there are now 6,365,595 positive cases, 190,887 deaths and 84,558,560 people that have been tested. Yesterday there were 6,329,861 cases, 189,699 deaths and 83,964,567 people that had been tested. There were 35,734 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 1,188 deaths.

In Nebraska there are now 36,917 cases and there have been 421 deaths. Yesterday there had been 36,469 positive cases and 407 deaths. 448 new confirmed cases have been identified since yesterday and 116 of the new cases were in Douglas County. 385,349 people have been tested in the state. Yesterday 378,300 people had been tested. We now have had 102 confirmed cases in Nemaha County, eleven in Pawnee County, forty-eight in Richardson County, twenty-nine in Johnson County and 127 in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 14,158 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 1,899 confirmed cases in Hall County, 1,037 cases in Dawson County and 2,064 cases in Dakota County. There are now 154 cases in Gage County and 4,699 cases in Lancaster County.
