RE: Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning and thanks for reading this update. . The Southeast District Health Department updated the information on their website on Friday, September 18th. There are twelve new cases in their area. There was one additional case in Nemaha County, two additional cases in Johnson County, three additional cases in Richardson County and six additional cases in Otoe County. This makes a total of 357 cases and two deaths in the district. 162 of the cases were diagnosed in the last thirty days. I encourage you to go to the Southeast District Health Department website's dashboard where there is much more information on the cases in this area.

As of 9:00 this morning there were 31,103,347 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 30,814,638. There have been 961,435 deaths. Yesterday there had been 957,632 deaths.

In the United States there are now 6,813,984 positive cases, 199,525 deaths and 95,108,559 people that have been tested. Yesterday there were 6,766,724 cases, 199,268 deaths and 94,211,463 people that had been tested. There were 47,260 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 257 deaths.

In Nebraska there are now 41,083 cases and there have been 442 deaths. Yesterday there had been 40,797 positive cases and 442 deaths. 286 new confirmed cases have been identified since yesterday and 77 of the new cases were in Douglas County. 423,360 people have been tested in the state. Yesterday 419,995 people had been tested. We now have had 115 confirmed cases in Nemaha County, twelve in Pawnee County, fifty-five in Richardson County, thirty-six in Johnson County and 139 in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 15,184 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 1,959 confirmed cases in Hall County, 1,067 cases in Dawson County and 2,150 cases in Dakota County. There are now 201 cases in Gage County and 5,681 cases in Lancaster County.
