RE: Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning and thanks for reading this update. The Southeast District Health Department updated the information on their website on Friday, September 25th. There are 15 new cases of COVID-19 in their area. There were three additional case in Nemaha County, five additional cases in Johnson County, two additional cases in Pawnee County and five additional cases in Otoe County. This makes a total of 399 cases and two deaths in the district. 156 of the cases were diagnosed in the last thirty days. I encourage you to go to the Southeast District Health Department website's dashboard where there is much more information on the cases in this area.

As of 9:00 this morning there were 33,145,948 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 32,880,857. There have been 998,489 deaths. Yesterday there had been 994,810 deaths.

In the United States there are now 7,117,116 positive cases, 204,762 deaths and 101,298,794 people that have been tested. Yesterday there were 7,079,869 cases, 204,499 deaths and 100,492,536 people that had been tested. There were 37,247 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 313 deaths.

In Nebraska there are now 44,063 cases and there have been 470 deaths. Yesterday there had been 43,596 positive cases and 469 deaths. 467 new confirmed cases have been identified since yesterday and 163 of the new cases were in Douglas County. 445,129 people have been tested in the state. Yesterday 440,645 people had been tested. We now have had 127 confirmed cases in Nemaha County, 16 in Pawnee County, 59 in Richardson County, 46 in Johnson County and 151 in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 16,013 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 2,015 confirmed cases in Hall County, 1,083 cases in Dawson County and 2,215 cases in Dakota County. There are now 249 cases in Gage County and 6,253 cases in Lancaster County.
