RE: Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning and thanks for reading this update. The Southeast District Health Department updated the information on their website on Wednesday, September 30th. There are 10 new cases of COVID-19 in their area. There were three additional cases in Nemaha County, three additional cases in Johnson County and five additional cases in Otoe County. One case was removed from the total for Pawnee County. This makes a total of 437 cases and two deaths in the district. 164 of the cases were diagnosed in the last thirty days. I encourage you to go to the Southeast District Health Department website's dashboard where there is much more information on the cases in this area.

As of 9:00 this morning there were 34,018,143 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 33,706,888. There have been 1,015,049 deaths. Yesterday there had been 1,008,993 deaths.

In the United States there are now 7,235,485 positive cases, 206,963 deaths and 103,939,667 people that have been tested. Yesterday there were 7,191,519 cases, 206,005 deaths and 103,155,189 people that had been tested. There were 43,966 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 958 deaths.

In Nebraska there are now 45,564 cases and there have been 478 deaths. Yesterday there had been 45,044 positive cases and 478 deaths. 520 new confirmed cases have been identified since yesterday and 141 of the new cases were in Douglas County. 455,638 people have been tested in the state. Yesterday 452,557 people had been tested. We now have had 132 confirmed cases in Nemaha County, 16 in Pawnee County, 61 in Richardson County, 62 in Johnson County and 166 in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 16,424 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 2,039 confirmed cases in Hall County, 1,090 cases in Dawson County and 2,240 cases in Dakota County. There are now 265 cases in Gage County and 6,490 cases in Lancaster County.
