RE: Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning and thanks for reading this update. The Southeast District Health Department updated the information on their website on Friday, October 9th. There are 30 new cases of COVID-19 in their area. There were seven additional cases in Nemaha County, two additional cases in Johnson County, 14 additional cases in Otoe County, one additional case in Pawnee County and six additional cases in Richardson County. This makes a total of 542 cases and three deaths in the district. 225 of the cases were diagnosed in the last thirty days.

As of 9:00 this morning there were 37,587,354 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 37,272,305. There have been 1,077,672 deaths. Yesterday there had been 1,073,824 deaths.

In the United States there are now 7,764,270 positive cases, 214,776 deaths and 115,424,481 people that have been tested. Yesterday there were 7,720,591 cases, 214,379 deaths and 114,480,836 people that had been tested. There were 43,679 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 397 deaths.

The data for Nebraska was faulty over the weekend. There were no new cases shown for Friday and a large number of cases shown for Saturday. I don't know what happened but if you average the numbers out, we still had a significant increase in cases over the weekend.

In Nebraska there are now 52,382 cases and there have been 519 deaths. Yesterday there had been 51,887 positive cases and 519 deaths. 495 new confirmed cases have been identified since yesterday and 124 of the new cases were in Douglas County. 508,921 people have been tested in the state. Yesterday 504,432 people had been tested. We now have had 159 confirmed cases in Nemaha County, 20 in Pawnee County, 78 in Richardson County, 73 in Johnson County and 112 in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 18,314 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 2,233 confirmed cases in Hall County, 1,141 cases in Dawson County and 2,381 cases in Dakota County. There are now 337 cases in Gage County and 7,385 cases in Lancaster County.
