RE: Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning and thanks for reading this update. First of all, I apologize for not posting an update on Friday. I had meetings all day and just didn't find the time.

The Southeast District Health Department updated the information on their website on Friday, October 23rd. There are 34 new cases of COVID-19 in their area. There were 10 additional cases in Nemaha County, four additional cases in Johnson County, 19 additional cases in Otoe County, no additional cases in Pawnee County and one additional case in Richardson County. This makes a total of 693 cases and three deaths in the district. 307 of the cases were diagnosed in the last thirty days.

As of 9:00 this morning there were 43,170,766 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 44,740,047. There have been 1,155,434 deaths. Yesterday there had been 1,151,059 deaths.

In the United States there are now 8,638,127 positive cases, 225,239 deaths and 132,568,375 people that have been tested. Yesterday there were 8,578,415 cases, 224,906 deaths and 131,455,226 people that had been tested. There were 59,712 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 333 deaths.

In Nebraska there are now 63,797 cases and there have been 596 deaths. Yesterday there had been 63,215 positive cases and 595 deaths. 582 new confirmed cases have been identified since yesterday and 167 of the new cases were in Douglas County. 567,426 people have been tested in the state. Yesterday 564,275 people had been tested. We now have had 183 confirmed cases in Nemaha County, 24 in Pawnee County, 102 in Richardson County, 93 in Johnson County and 291 in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 21,606 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 2,589 confirmed cases in Hall County, 1,267 cases in Dawson County and 2,526 cases in Dakota County. There are now 526 cases in Gage County and 8,722 cases in Lancaster County.
