RE: Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning and thanks for reading this update. The Southeast District Health Department updated the information on their website on Friday, October 30th. There are 28 new cases of COVID-19 in their area. There were six additional cases in Nemaha County, no additional cases in Johnson County, five additional cases in Otoe County, three additional cases in Pawnee County and 14 additional cases in Richardson County. This makes a total of 780 cases and three deaths in the district. 325 of the cases were diagnosed in the last thirty days.

As of 9:00 this morning there were 46,632,558 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 46,182,839. There have been 1,201,927 deaths. Yesterday there had been 1,197,026 deaths.

In the United States there are now 9,209,165 positive cases, 231,003 deaths and 147,218,569 people that have been tested. Yesterday there were 9,127,402 cases, 230,566 deaths and 146,150,525 people that had been tested. There were 81,763 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 437 deaths.

In Nebraska there are now 71,666 cases and there have been 654 deaths. Yesterday there had been 70,732 positive cases and 652 deaths. 934 new confirmed cases have been identified since yesterday and 229 of the new cases were in Douglas County. Something strange happened with the number of tests being reported over the weekend. The numbers jumped from 580,729 on Thursday to 920,664 on Friday. I am looking for the answer to why this happened. We now have had 201 confirmed cases in Nemaha County, 28 in Pawnee County, 146 in Richardson County, 96 in Johnson County and 309 in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 23,605 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 2,790 confirmed cases in Hall County, 1,363 cases in Dawson County and 2,604 cases in Dakota County. There are now 600 cases in Gage County and 9,653 cases in Lancaster County.
