**RE:** Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning and thanks for reading this update. What is it going to take for us to take this virus seriously? Maybe it was a slight inconvenience to you but very slight? Well, there is something you can do. Wear a mask when you are in public. If you want to go a step further, stay home as much as possible. As of 9:00 this morning there were 51,621,135 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 50,913,451. There have been 1,274,661 deaths. Yesterday there had been 1,263,089 deaths.

In the United States there are now 10,260,282 positive cases and 239,695 deaths. Yesterday there were 10,110,552 cases and 238,251 deaths. There were 149,730 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 1,444 deaths.

In Nebraska there are now 87,733 cases and there have been 730 deaths. Yesterday there had been 85,551 positive cases and 710 deaths. 2,182 new confirmed cases have been identified since yesterday and 686 of the new cases were in Douglas County. We now have had 263 confirmed cases in Nemaha County, 34 in Pawnee County, 211 in Richardson County, 146 in Johnson County and 438 in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 28,070 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 3,202 confirmed cases in Hall County, 1,550 cases in Dawson County and 2,744 cases in Dakota County. There are now 797 cases in Gage County and 11,449 cases in Lancaster County.
