RE: Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning and thanks for reading this update. The Southeast District Health Department updated the information on their website on Thursday, November 12th. There are 49 new cases of COVID-19 in their area. They report one less case in Nemaha County, nine additional cases in Johnson County, 28 additional cases in Otoe County, seven additional cases in Pawnee County and six additional cases in Richardson County. This makes a total of 1141 cases and four deaths in the district. 572 of the cases were diagnosed in the last 30 days.

Hospitals across the state, both urban and rural, are reporting record numbers of COVID patients. All hospitals are considering not offering elective procedures. Some have already made this move. Please be very aware of the situation in our area. We may need to make a similar move.

As of 9:00 this morning there were 52,899,849 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 52,289,705. There have been 1,295,841 deaths. Yesterday there had been 1,286,926 deaths.

In the United States there are now 10,560,771 positive cases and 242,477 deaths. Yesterday there were 10,403,745 cases and 241,809 deaths. There were 157,026 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 668 deaths.

In Nebraska there are now 92,553 cases and there have been 756 deaths. Yesterday there had been 89,942 positive cases and 731 deaths. 2,611 new confirmed cases have been identified since yesterday and 794 of the new cases were in Douglas County. We now have had 262 confirmed cases in Nemaha County, 41 in Pawnee County, 216 in Richardson County, 155 in Johnson County and 466 in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 29,397 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 3,430 confirmed cases in Hall County, 1,610 cases in Dawson County and 2,788 cases in Dakota County. There are now 927 cases in Gage County and 12,002 cases in Lancaster County.
