RE: Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning and thanks for reading this update. The Southeast District Health Department updated the information on their website on Friday, November 13th. There are 199 new cases of COVID-19 in their area. There are 12 new cases in Nemaha County, 84 additional cases in Johnson County, 61 additional cases in Otoe County, five additional cases in Pawnee County and 37 additional cases in Richardson County. This makes a total of 1340 cases and four deaths in the district. 742 of the cases were diagnosed in the last 30 days.

Hospitals across the state, both urban and rural, are continuing to report record numbers of COVID patients. All hospitals are considering not offering elective procedures. Some have already made this move. Please be very aware of the situation in our area. We may need to make a similar move.

As of 9:00 this morning there were 54,506,165 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 54,046,529. There have been 1,319,267 deaths. Yesterday there had been 1,313,201 deaths.

In the United States there are now 11,043,487 positive cases and 246,237 deaths. Yesterday there were 10,906,725 cases and 245,614 deaths. There were 136,762 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 623 deaths.

In Nebraska there are now 98,161 cases and there have been 779 deaths. Yesterday there had been 96,834 positive cases and 779 deaths. 1,327 new confirmed cases have been identified since yesterday and 277 of the new cases were in Douglas County. We now have had 274 confirmed cases in Nemaha County, 46 in Pawnee County, 254 in Richardson County, 239 in Johnson County and 527 in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 30,232 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 3,586 confirmed cases in Hall County, 1,697 cases in Dawson County and 2,856 cases in Dakota County. There are now 1,001 cases in Gage County and 12,766 cases in Lancaster County.
