**RE:** Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning and thanks for reading this update. The Southeast District Health Department updated the information on their website on Monday, November 23<sup>rd</sup>. There are 118 new cases of COVID-19 in their area. I can't make the increases per county equal the total increase in new cases in the district so am not going to post those numbers. The district shows a total of 1784 cases and seven deaths in the district. 1,088 of the cases were diagnosed in the last 30 days.

Even in these very uncertain times, we have a great deal to be thankful for. There are now treatments available for COVID-19 that have drastically decreased the number of deaths from the disease. Not nearly as many patients are ending up on a ventilator. We all have jobs and amazing co-workers. As Susanne's exercise showed us, when we focus on what we are grateful for, our thought processes change considerably.

As of 9:00 this morning there were 59,939,306 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 59,365,258. There have been 1,412,669 deaths. Yesterday there had been 1,399,782 deaths.

In the United States there are now 12,605,047 positive cases and 260,065 deaths. Yesterday there were 12,428,855 cases and 257,929 deaths. There were 176,192 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 2,136 deaths.

In Nebraska there are now 117,682 cases and there have been 950 deaths. Yesterday there had been 115,921 positive cases and 934 deaths. 1,761 new confirmed cases have been identified since yesterday and 541 of the new cases were in Douglas County. We now have had 353 confirmed cases in Nemaha County, 69 in Pawnee County, 346 in Richardson County, 306 in Johnson County and 692 in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 36,925 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 4,341 confirmed cases in Hall County, 1,915 cases in Dawson County and 3,057 cases in Dakota County. There are now 1,189 cases in Gage County and 15,020 cases in Lancaster County.
