RE: Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning and thanks for reading this update. The Southeast District Health Department updated the information on their website on Wednesday, November 25th. The district shows a total of 1812 cases and seven deaths in the district. 1,119 of the cases were diagnosed in the last 30 days.

Mayor Dan White of Auburn issued a proclamation on Wednesday, November 25th requiring masks to be worn in Auburn in all public places, with a few exceptions, until December 14th when the city council meets. At that time, the city council can decide how to proceed. I applaud the mayor for his leadership in this difficult time. I am sure he is taking some criticism for this but, in my opinion, it is the right thing to do to protect the citizens of this community.

As of 9:00 this morning there were 62,849,187 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 62,378,353. There have been 1,461,376 deaths. Yesterday there had been 1,454,819 deaths.

In the United States there are now 13,389,786 positive cases and 266,887 deaths. Yesterday there were 13,247,384 cases and 266,074 deaths. There were 142,402 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 813 deaths.

In Nebraska there are now 126,466 cases and there have been 989 deaths. Yesterday there had been 125,323 positive cases and 989 deaths. 1,143 new confirmed cases have been identified since yesterday and 407 of the new cases were in Douglas County. We now have had 356 confirmed cases in Nemaha County, 73 in Pawnee County, 370 in Richardson County, 307 in Johnson County and 716 in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 39,962 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 4,566 confirmed cases in Hall County, 1,985 cases in Dawson County and 3,142 cases in Dakota County. There are now 1,281 cases in Gage County and 16,443 cases in Lancaster County.
