As of 9:00 this morning there were 88,203,229 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 87,364,576. There have been 1,901,510 deaths. Yesterday there had been 1,886,603 deaths.

In the United States there are now 21,589,666 positive cases and 365,448 deaths. Yesterday there were 21,307,125 cases and 361,312 deaths. There were 282,541 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 4,136 deaths.

In Nebraska there are now 173,591 cases and there have been 1,811 deaths. Yesterday there had been 172,469 positive cases and 1,703 deaths. This makes 108 new deaths identified yesterday. I think that this must be due to a backlog in the reporting of deaths over the holidays. 1,122 new confirmed cases have been identified since yesterday and 355 of the new cases were in Douglas County. We now have had 601 confirmed cases in Nemaha County, 171 in Pawnee County, 586 in Richardson County, 556 in Johnson County and 1,054 in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 55,668 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 5,992 confirmed cases in Hall County, 2,557 cases in Dawson County and 3,540 cases in Dakota County. There are now 1,885 cases in Gage County and 23,639 cases in Lancaster County.
