As of 9:00 this morning there were 93,240,925 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 92,484,759. There have been 1,997,095 deaths. Yesterday there had been 1,981,802 deaths.

In the United States there are now 23,315,721 positive cases and 388,725 deaths. Yesterday there were 23,079,161 cases and 384,794 deaths. There were 236,560 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 3,930 deaths.

In Nebraska there are now 180,131 cases and there have been 1,818 deaths. Yesterday there had been 179,199 positive cases and 1,803 deaths. 932 new confirmed cases have been identified since yesterday and 267 of the new cases were in Douglas County. We now have had 646 confirmed cases in Nemaha County, 178 in Pawnee County, 613 in Richardson County, 589 in Johnson County and 1,103 in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 57,799 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 6,284 confirmed cases in Hall County, 2,605 cases in Dawson County and 3,597 cases in Dakota County. There are now 1,935 cases in Gage County and 24,697 cases in Lancaster County.
