RE: Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning! With the number of new cases of COVID-19, as well as the hospitalizations, decreasing in the state, my attention is turning to the rate at which we are vaccinating the citizens of this state. The bottle neck in this process seems to be getting enough vaccine delivered to our state to meet the demand for vaccinations. I am not sure what is holding up the vaccine, but at the rate we are receiving doses, it is going to take a long time to get it to everyone that wants it. Hopefully this situation gets resolved soon.

As of 9:00 this morning there were 95,668,817 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 95,135,784. There have been 2,043,806 deaths. Yesterday there had been 2,032,787 deaths.

In the United States there are now 24,081,790 positive cases and 399,008 deaths. Yesterday there were 23,938,288 cases and 397,611 deaths. There were 143,502 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 1,397 deaths.

In Nebraska there are now 182,176 cases and there have been 1,842 deaths. Yesterday there had been 181,978 positive cases and 1,837 deaths. 198 new confirmed cases have been identified since yesterday and 68 of the new cases were in Douglas County. We now have had 655 confirmed cases in Nemaha County, 179 in Pawnee County, 627 in Richardson County, 594 in Johnson County and 1,111 in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 58,447 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 6,364 confirmed cases in Hall County, 2,619 cases in Dawson County and 3,608 cases in Dakota County. There are now 1,956 cases in Gage County and 25,107 cases in Lancaster County.
