**RE:** Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning! The Southeast District Health Department updated the information on their website on Friday, January 23<sup>rd</sup>. There are 81 new cases of COVID-19 in their area. Eight of the new cases are in Johnson County, 23 are in Nemaha County, 32 are in Otoe County, five are in Pawnee County and 13 are in Richardson County. This makes a total of 3,294 cases and 40 deaths in the district. 580 of the cases were diagnosed in the last 30 days.

I had two Zoom meetings first thing in the morning yesterday and by the time they were over it was time to head home before I got snowed in in town. Thus, I didn't have time to write an update yesterday.

As of 9:00 this morning there were 99,808,397 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 99,396,099. There have been 2,142,826 deaths. Yesterday there had been 2,134,210 deaths.

In the United States there are now 25,298,554 positive cases and 421,239 deaths. Yesterday there were 25,173,485 cases and 419,621 deaths. There were 125,069 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 1,618 deaths.

In Nebraska there are now 187,793 cases and there have been 1,894 deaths. Yesterday there had been 187,147 positive cases and 1,879 deaths. 646 new confirmed cases have been identified since yesterday and 225 of the new cases were in Douglas County. We now have had 681 confirmed cases in Nemaha County, 188 in Pawnee County, 644 in Richardson County, 609 in Johnson County and 1,172 in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 60,026 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 6,530 confirmed cases in Hall County, 2,667 cases in Dawson County and 3,646 cases in Dakota County. There are now 1,992 cases in Gage County and 26,205 cases in Lancaster County.
