RE: Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning! The Southeast District Health Department updated the information on their website on Tuesday, January 26th. There are 25 new cases of COVID-19 in their area and eight more deaths. One of the new cases is in Johnson County, 11 are in Nemaha County, eight are in Otoe County, one is in Pawnee County and four are in Richardson County. This makes a total of 3,319 cases and 48 deaths in the district. 522 of the cases were diagnosed in the last 30 days.

We just passed 100 million cases of COVID-19 in the world! That is a lot of people with the disease. But what I cannot understand is why one fourth of those cases are in the United States and one fourth of the deaths are also in this country. We are the richest country in the world! Why can't we get control of this disease?

As of 9:00 this morning there were 100,389,150 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 99,808,397. There have been 2,160,850 deaths. Yesterday there had been 2,142,826 deaths.

In the United States there are now 25,445,700 positive cases and 425,257 deaths. Yesterday there were 25,298,554 cases and 421,239 deaths. There were 147,146 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. yesterday and 4,018 deaths.

In Nebraska there are now 188,122 cases and there have been 1,905 deaths. Yesterday there had been 187,793 positive cases and 1,894 deaths. 329 new confirmed cases have been identified since yesterday and 126 of the new cases were in Douglas County. We now have had 692 confirmed cases in Nemaha County, 189 in Pawnee County, 648 in Richardson County, 610 in Johnson County and 1,180 in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 60,377 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 6,545 confirmed cases in Hall County, 2,667 cases in Dawson County and 3,640 cases in Dakota County. There are now 1,992 cases in Gage County and 26,280 cases in Lancaster County.
