**RE:** Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning! The Southeast District Health Department updated the information on their website on Wednesday, February 3<sup>rd</sup>. There are 51 new cases of COVID-19 in their area and two additional deaths. Eight of the new cases are in Johnson County, five are in Nemaha County, 27 are in Otoe County, seven are in Pawnee County and four are in Richardson County. This makes a total of 3,424 cases and 50 deaths in the district. 401 of the cases were diagnosed in the last 30 days.

I was out of the office for the last two days. I went out west to see my mother. I thought it was finally safe for me to be around her. I hadn't seen her in over a year and she is almost 87 years old! She volunteers at the North Platte hospital so she has been able to receive her vaccinations right along with the employees, which is really nice. Anyway, when you look at the numbers, these are increases in the last three days, not just the last day.

As of 9:00 this morning there were 105,006,686 cases in the world. On 2/2 there were 103,523,528. There have been 2,287,129 deaths. On 2/1 there had been 2,241,147 deaths.

In the United States there are now 26,680,536 positive cases and 455,882 deaths. On 2/1 there were 26,332,785 cases and 443,636 deaths. There were 357,751 new cases diagnosed in the U.S. in the last three days and 12,246 deaths.

In Nebraska there are now 192,549 cases and there have been 1,952 deaths. On 2/1 there had been 190,950 positive cases and 1,920 deaths. 1,599 new confirmed cases have been identified since 2/1 and 465 of those cases were in Douglas County. We now have had 707 confirmed cases in Nemaha County, 199 in Pawnee County, 656 in Richardson County, 623 in Johnson County and 1,240 in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 61,734 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 6,734 confirmed cases in Hall County, 2,703 cases in Dawson County and 3,660 cases in Dakota County. There are now 2,006 cases in Gage County and 27,000 cases in Lancaster County.
