RE: Daily COVID-19 Update

Good morning! The Southeast District Health Department updated the information on their website on Monday, February 22nd. There are 13 new cases of COVID-19 in their area. One of the new cases is in Johnson County, none are in Nemaha County, five are in Otoe County, three are in Pawnee County and four are in Richardson County. This makes a total of 3,551 cases and 53 deaths in the district. 226 of the cases were diagnosed in the last 30 days.

As the number of new cases continues to decrease and the changes from day to day are much less dramatic than they have been in the past, I am thinking of changing this report from a “daily” report to a “weekly” report. What does everyone think of this change? I will continue to collect the data daily but provide you with a report on a weekly basis. Your thoughts on this change are appreciated.

As of 9:00 this morning there were 111,830,264 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 111,518,562. There have been 2,476,826 deaths. Yesterday there had been 2,468,646 deaths.

In the United States there are now 28,191,227 positive cases and 500,443 deaths. Yesterday there were 28,135,045 cases and 499,056 deaths. There were 56,182 new cases diagnosed yesterday and 1,387 deaths.

Nebraska entered no new data for today so the totals are the same as yesterday. In Nebraska there are now 199,045 cases and there have been 2,047 deaths. Yesterday there had been 198,751 positive cases and 2,047 deaths. 294 new confirmed cases have been identified since yesterday and 99 of those cases were in Douglas County. We now have had 725 confirmed cases in Nemaha County, 215 in Pawnee County, 675 in Richardson County, 635 in Johnson County and 1,301 in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 63,339 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 6,984 confirmed cases in Hall County, 2,763 cases in Dawson County and 3,700 cases in Dakota County. There are now 2,072 cases in Gage County and 27,848 cases in Lancaster County.
