**RE:** Weekly COVID-19 Update

Good morning! The Southeast District Health Department updated the information on their website on Monday, April 5<sup>th</sup> and Friday, April 9<sup>th</sup>. There is a total of 24 new cases and two additional deaths in the district in the last week. Four of the new cases are in Johnson County, two are in Nemaha County, 15 are in Otoe County, none are in Pawnee County and three are in Richardson County. This makes a total of 3,806 cases and 61 deaths in the district. 122 of the cases were diagnosed in the last 30 days.

There have been some people interested in knowing the number vaccinations that have been given by our hospital. So far, we have administered 2,900 doses of vaccine. We gave 251 doses last week.

As of 9:00 this morning there were 136,174,000 cases in the world. Yesterday there were 135,469,242. There have been 2,938,740 deaths. Yesterday there had been 2,929,851 deaths.

In the United States there are now 31,198,546 positive cases and 562,067 deaths. Yesterday there were 30,672,830 cases and 561,783 deaths. There were 46,642 new cases diagnosed yesterday and 284 deaths.

In Nebraska there are now 214,207 cases and there have been 2,220 deaths. Yesterday there had been 214,010 positive cases and 2,220 deaths. 197 new confirmed cases have been identified since yesterday and 65 of those cases were in Douglas County. We now have had 762 confirmed cases in Nemaha County, 236 in Pawnee County, 773 in Richardson County, 649 in Johnson County and 1,410 in Otoe County. These are the numbers of cases in each county as reported by the Southeast District Health Department. 68,565 of the Nebraska cases are in Douglas County. There have now been 7,633 confirmed cases in Hall County, 2,866 cases in Dawson County and 3,865 cases in Dakota County. There are now 2,165 cases in Gage County and 30,202 cases in Lancaster County.
